

Pupil Destinations, Results & Scholarship Awards 2023/24

Year 8 Destination Schools & Common Entrance Results

At the end of the academic year 2023/24, the children's destination schools for Year 9 included:

- Bryanston School
- Charterhouse School
- Cranbrook School
- Dover College
- King's School Canterbury
- Millfield School
- Sutton Valence School
- Holyport College
- Lycée Français de Madrid

Pupils were offered the following scholarships:

- Sports scholarship to Dover College
- Sports scholarship to St Edmund's, Canterbury
- D.T. scholarship to King's Canterbury School
- D.T. scholarship to St Edmund's, Canterbury
- Academic Exhibition to Sutton Valence School

In the ISEB Common Entrance (13+) exams, the average percentage score achieved across all papers was 68%. The cohort attained the highest percentage scores in the following papers. Advanced Maths, English & Languages remain a core strength of the school.

Additional Maths: 98%
Calculator: 88%
Non-Calculator: 86%
English Reading: 80%
Mental Maths: 73%
Spanish: 73%

Section Française Bilingue Destination Schools

At the end of the academic year 2023/24, the children's destination schools included:

In the Tests d'Entrée, accredited by the Lycée Français Charles de Gaulle de Londres, 93.5% of pupils passed their entrée en 4e and entrée en 5e exams. The cohort attained these average percentage scores:

- Entrée en 4e:
 - o 64.75% French
 - o 62.8% Maths
- Entrée en 5e:
 - o 68.5% French
 - o 67.7% Maths

Cambridge English Qualification Exams

Pupils in the Section Française Bilingue and EAL pupils in Years 7 and 8 achieved a 100% pass rate in Cambridge English Qualification Exams, with children taking either the A2 Key (KET) exam, B1 Preliminary (PET) exam, or B2 First (FCE) exam.

- 71% of pupils achieved either Grade A or B in the A2 Key exams
- 90% of pupils achieved either Grade A or B in the B1 Preliminary exams

The B2 First exam is typically taken by students in preparation for studying at English-speaking universities. 5 pupils aged 13 years old took the exam, with 1 achieving Grade A, 2 Grade B, and 2 Grade C.

Year 6 Destination Schools & Kent Test (11+) Results

At the end of the academic year 2023/24, pupils leaving the school at Year 6 went on to both Grammar and Independent Senior Schools, including:

- St Lawrence College, Ramsgate
- Kent College, Canterbury
- King's School Canterbury
- Folkestone School for Girls
- Sydenham High School for Girls

In 2023/4, 5 pupils registered to take the Kent Test (11+) Exam with an 80% pass rate.

In 2024/5, 11 pupils registered to take the Kent Test (11+) Exam with a 73% pass rate.

Early Years Foundation Stage Early Learning Goals

At the end of the academic year 2023/24, 98% of the children in Reception class met their Early Learning Goals in the 3 prime areas and 5 specific areas of learning. In 2023, the national average was 67.2%.

Many of the cohort were assessed as 'exceeding' in areas of learning with:

- 75% of pupils exceeding in the Understanding the World area
- 69% of pupils exceeding in the Personal, Social & Emotional Development area
- 69% of pupils exceeding in the Physical Development area
- 69% of pupils exceeding in the Expressive Arts & Design area
- 56% of pupils exceeding in the Communication & Language area
- 56% of pupils exceeding in the Mathematics area
- 50% of pupils exceeding in the Literacy area.
