Science

Testing for carbon dioxide explained by Year 8 pupils Israel and Esme.

The copper carbonate was a green powder which was connected to another tube containing lime water. To determine whether there was carbon dioxide produced, the lime water would have to turn cloudy.

We added sulfuric acid to the tube which contained the copper carbonate and then observed a fizzing. The reaction created the products copper sulfate, water and carbon dioxide.
