### St Pauls KAASO

It is great news that schools in Uganda have reopened in January. For many of the children, this will be their first time back at school in nearly two years so they are VERY excited to re-

turn!

However, they don't have enough double decker metal bunk beds to house all of the returning children who live at the school. The current beds are wooden triple decker bunks which are now illegal and the wood is frequently infested with bed bugs.

They are hoping to purchase 120 metal double decker bunks (240 beds total) to house the returning students. If you are able to help, £40 buys a bed or £75 buys a bunkbed.
